## WINNERS IN MANY WAYS...



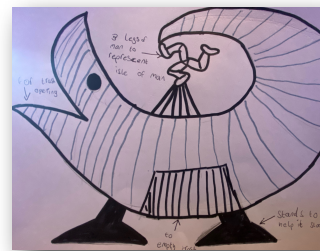

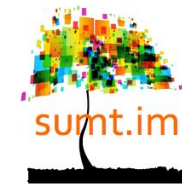


## WHAT OTHER SPECIAL THINGS HAVE WE ACHIEVED?
