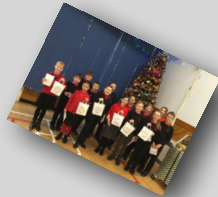

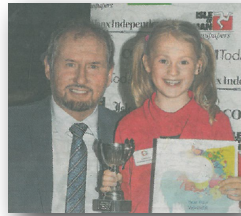
What would we do without you!?!

- * We had a very pleasing Maths Moderation where the external moderators agreed with our assessments of pupils and recognised that some of our staff could be used as model practitioners for other teachers on the Isle of Man in Maths Mastery and Assessment for Learning.
- * Thanks to our Danceathon and funds remaining this academic year we are going to see the Reception Class canopy enclosed in the very near future and enhancing outdoor learning opportunities.
- * Mrs Dunlop, with the help of Anagh Coar families, revitalised the garden at Tynwald for 2019 - capturing many elements of new school priorities and interests within the design. Once again it is well worth a visit if you get the chance!
- * We hosted an event for the 2nd year running for all 26 Edge Hill University student teachers to share our approach to outdoor learning in a school with limited resources! This was well received and we gained positive feedback on how this would support them in their future careers.
- * We have fundraised for a number of charities this year with your help - ensuring that we are playing our part for those in need. Thank you! These have included: Macmillan Cancer, MSPCA, Hospice Isle of Man, Old & Young Together at Christmas, Leprosy Mission (through stamp collection) and the Poppy Appeal.
- * Year 6 have continued to expand on our transition programme for high school which has included a record 10 lessons at Ballakermeen in a range of subjects, 1 induction day, visits to Anagh Coar plus the Primary Concert rehearsals and show - wow!
- * One of our teachers was recognised with a special award from Edge Hill University for providing outstanding mentoring and support for our student teachers.
